



## Ad-Hoc Query on Fees for issuance of residence permits to third-country nationals

Requested by LU EMN NCP and COM on 18<sup>th</sup> March 2014

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### **1. Background Information**

**Council Directive 2003/109/EC concerning the status of third-country nationals who are long-term residents** determines the terms for conferring and withdrawing long-term resident status granted by a Member State in relation to third-country nationals legally residing in its territory and the rights pertaining thereto. In particular, article 8.2 of the Directive foresees that Member States issue long-term resident's EC residence permits to long-term residents. Such permits shall be valid at least for five years and upon application if required automatically renewable on expiry. Member States are allowed to levy charges for the issuance of such permits.

**Council Directive 2003/86/EC on the right to family reunification** determines the conditions under which family reunification is granted, as well as the rights of the family members concerned. In particular, article 13.2 of the Directive foresees that Member States issue a renewable residence permit

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to family members of at least one year. Article 15.1 of the Directive foresees that that after five years of residence at the latest, and if no residence permit was granted for other reasons, Member States must issue, upon application, an autonomous residence permit, independent of the sponsor, to the spouse or unmarried partner and a child who has reached majority. Member States are allowed to levy charges for the issuance of such permits.

**Council Directive 2009/50/EC on the conditions of entry and residence of third-country nationals for the purposes of highly qualified employment** (so called ‘**Blue Card Directive**’) facilitates access to the labour market and entitles holders to socio-economic rights and favourable conditions for family reunification and movement around the EU. In particular, article 7 of the Directive foresees that a third-country national who has applied and fulfils the requirements set out in Article 5 and for whom the competent authorities have taken a positive decision in accordance with Article 8 shall be issued with an EU Blue Card. Member States are allowed to levy charges for the issuance of such an ‘EU Blue Card’ permit.

**Council Directive 2004/114/EC** determines the conditions of admission of third-country nationals for the purposes of **studies, pupil exchange, unremunerated training or voluntary service**. Only the rules for students are mandatory. The Directive foresees a set of general conditions (Art. 6) as well as specific conditions for students (Art. 7). Art. 11 determines that a residence permit for a student shall be issued for at least one year and be renewable if the general and specific conditions continue to be met. Art. 20 states that Member States may require applicants to pay fees for the processing of applications.

**Council Directive 2005/71/EC** creates a specific admission procedure for third-country nationals for the **purposes of scientific research**. The conditions for admission are laid down in Art. 7, while Art. 8 determines that the residence permit shall be issued for a period of at least one year if the conditions are met, and be renewable if the conditions continue to be met. Recital 21 states that Member States should have the right to charge applicants for the processing of applications.

**Directive 2011/98/EU** (so called “**Single Permit Directive**”) became operational in the Member States at the latest on 25.12.2013. Article 10 (Fees) of that Directive states that "Member States may require applicants to pay fees, where appropriate, for handling applications in accordance with this Directive". The level of such fees shall be proportionate and may be based on the services actually provided for the processing of applications and the issuance of permits." This Directive applies to some residence cards issued under EU law (e. g. family reunification, students who have access to the labour market, Researchers) as well as national residence permits giving access to the labour market, and excludes a number of specific categories of workers (such as posted workers, seasonal workers, Intra corporate transferees, self-employed persons and EC long term residents).

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**Council Directive 2004/81/EC of 29 April 2004** defines the conditions for granting **residence permits** of limited duration to non-European Union (EU) nationals who are **victims of human trafficking** or (optionally) the subject of an action relating to the smuggling of people and who cooperate in the fight against these crimes. The permit may be granted to non-EU nationals even if they have irregularly entered the territory of an EU country. Art. 8 stipulates that the competent authorities are responsible for assessing whether the victim's presence is deemed necessary for the investigation or judicial proceedings, whether he/she has shown a clear intention to cooperate, and whether he/she has severed all relations with those suspected perpetrators. When these three conditions are fulfilled, and subject to public policy and national security, a residence permit of limited duration will be issued. The residence permit is valid for at least six months and may be renewed if the relevant conditions continue to be satisfied.

Therefore, the LU NCP and the Commission would like to receive from Member States an answer to the following questions:

1. What fees/charges are levied on the applicant by your Member State for the issuance of the first permit, renewal of and replacement (please distinguish clearly) of the following categories? If no fee is charged for renewals or replacements please indicate this. For all questions below, please indicate whether and how the fees relate to the costs of services provided in relation to each permit.
  - 1.1 EC long-term residence permits (please note if there is a difference between cards issued under article 8.3 and 8.4).
  - 1.2 Permits issued in accordance with Directive 2003/86/EC (family reunification), including charges for autonomous residence permit (under article 15 of Directive 2003/86/EC on family reunification).
  - 1.3 Temporary residence permit to victims of trafficking in human beings and, when appropriate, persons subject to facilitation of irregular immigration, in accordance with Directive 2004/81/EC.
  - 1.4 Permits issued for the purpose of study, pupil exchange, unremunerated trainees and au pairs issued in accordance with Directive 2004/114/EC.
  - 1.5 Permits issued for the purpose of research issued in accordance with Directive 2005/71/EC.
  - 1.6 EU Blue Cards, issued in accordance with Directive 2009/50/EC, including for family members falling under the scope of this Directive.
  - 1.7 Permits falling under the scope of "Single Permit" Directive 2011/98/EU (other than those relevant as mentioned above). Please specify all applicable categories of third-country nationals in case there is a difference in the fee charged, e. g. national long term resident permits, national temporary work permits, national permits for researchers if applicable, etc.

	<b>Belgium</b>	<b>Yes</b>	<p>1. <u>Preliminary notes:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ The below-mentioned amounts represent fees to be borne by municipalities for the issuance of (inter alia) cards and residence permits for foreign nationals. They relate to <b>manufacturing costs</b> to produce the said documents. Beside manufacturing costs, municipalities, that issue residence permits, may apply local taxes. Municipal taxes are covered by municipal autonomy and therefore differ from one municipality to another.</li> <li>▪ The below-mentioned amounts are applicable as from <b>1 January 2014</b>. On 1 January of each year, amounts are automatically revised based on the variation of the health index.</li> <li>▪ The below-mentioned amounts <b>aren't distinguished</b> by (i) first permit, renewal and replacement or (ii) the different types of permits (including cards A, B, C, D, E, E+, F, F+, H).</li> </ul> <p><u>Answer to question 1:</u>  Amounts borne by municipalities for issuing cards and residence permits to foreign nationals are as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ <b>Standard procedure: 15,20 Euros</b></li> <li>▪ <b>Emergency procedure: 116,90 Euros</b></li> </ul> <p><i>Please note that the emergency procedure as noted above doesn't represent a "fast track" procedure for the treatment of the application for authorization to stay in Belgium, but rather an <u>expedited manufacturing procedure</u>.</i></p>

Visa fees are indeed payable as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ For transit or short stay, visa fees generally amount to <b>60 Euros</b>. This amount (“handling fee”) covers administrative costs incurred by the processing of the visa application. Preliminary notes:</p> <p>The EMN study “Attracting highly qualified and qualified third-country nationals to Belgium” notes on page 16 that “There is no special system that foresees a fast-track procedure for economic immigrants. The same general legislation on migration and residence as adopted in the Aliens Act is applicable on all foreigners. However, in 2008 a special economic migration service was founded within the Immigration Office. The aim is to facilitate and accelerate procedures for foreigners whose intentions are of economic interest and to prevent them from being hampered in their business due to slow administrative procedures”.</p> <p>The EMN study “Visa policy as migration channel in Belgium” further states on page 38 that: “ By establishing the Smedem service, which</p>
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			<p>provides for a fast-track procedure for economic migrants, Belgium has definitely done everything possible to let these applications run as smoothly as possible. In this regard, it is also worth mentioning the pragmatic delegation of authority by the IS to the consulates in cases where residence criteria of a more objective nature are concerned and where the intrinsic examination of the visa application therefore remains limited: this indeed applies pre-eminently to workers with a work permit. This possibility that the consulates have of personally issuing a D visa, combined with the quick issue of a residence permit without additional intrinsic examination in the territory is the simplest and quickest working method to attract employees within the current Belgian context ».</p> <p><u>Answer to question 3:</u>  The <b>fast-track procedure offered by the Smedem service is not payable</b> and applies to the following categories:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Applicants for an EU blue card</li> <li>▪ Highly qualified workers</li> <li>▪ Researchers under hosting agreement</li> <li>▪ Persons obtaining a professional card</li> </ul> <p>The Smedem approach, in cooperation with Belgian consulates, is centered on 4 lines of action:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Quality of reception arrangements</li> <li>▪ Swift handling of applications</li> <li>▪ Lowering of burden of proof</li> <li>▪ Types of visa issued</li> </ul> <p>Finally, it is noteworthy that Belgian consulates may cooperate with <b>external service providers</b> facilitating several actions (information, appointment making, receipt of requests, etc.). The fee for processing the residence permit for a minor is set lower than the actual cost. 			<p>2. To stay in France, third-country nationals are required to hold a long-stay visa. The cost for the examination of the application for long-stay visa is 99€. Third-country nationals holding a long-stay visa equivalent to a residence permit (spouse of a French national, student, trainee, researcher, employee, temporary worker, employee on assignment, visitor, and spouse of a third-country national) must also pay a tax when they report to the French Office for Immigration and Integration (OFII). The amount of the tax is 58€ for students/trainees and 241€ for all other categories of migrants. Only temporary workers are exempt from this tax.</p> <p>If third-country nationals do not present a residence permit when they apply for the renewal of their permit, the renewal fee increases from 16€ for temporary residence permits and from 9€ for long-term residence permits. If third-country nationals submit their application for renewal after their residence permit has expired, they will also have to pay a visa fee of 180€ (except in cases of force majeure or presentation of a valid visa).</p> <p>Third-country nationals who entered France illegally or without holding the proper visa or found to be illegally present on French territory must pay, in addition to the tax related to the residence permit for which they apply, a visa fee of 340€ to be regularized.</p> <p>3. In France, one-stop-shops have been set up in many departments to receive applications and issue residence permits. They are coordinated by the OFII through its regional directorates. The one-stop-shops are aimed at labor migrants, who are not subject to labor market tests, i.e. third-country nationals who meet the criteria for “skills and talents”, or “employee on assignment” or “EU Blue Card”. They can also receive applications from young professionals and employees under the French-Russian Agreement. The goal of one-stop shops is to make available a single contact person who acts as the interface between the employer who is intending to bring a qualified third-country national to France, and the different government agencies. The advantage is to reduce the number of trips to prefectures made by both the employer and the employee.</p> <p>One-stop-shops procedures have also been set up for foreign students but only at the local level in certain parts of the territory. Such procedures result from local partnerships between local authorities, higher education establishments, mutual funds and the OFII.</p> <p>The use of one-stop-shops is not payable.</p>
