



Ad-Hoc Query on Fees for issuance of residence permits to third-country nationals

Requested by LU EMN NCP and COM on 18th March 2014

Reply requested by 15th April 2014

<u>Disclaimer</u>: The following responses have been provided primarily for the purpose of information exchange among EMN NCPs in the framework of the EMN. The contributing EMN NCPs have provided, to the best of their knowledge, information that is up-to-date, objective and reliable. Note, however, that the information provided does not necessarily represent the official policy of an EMN NCPs' Member State.

1. Background Information

Council Directive 2003/109/EC concerning the status of third-country nationals who are long-term residents determines the terms for conferring and withdrawing long-term resident status granted by a Member State in relation to third-country nationals legally residing in its territory and the rights pertaining thereto. In particular, article 8.2 of the Directive foresees that Member States issue long-term resident's EC residence permits to long-term residents. Such permits shall be valid at least for five years and upon application if required automatically renewable on expiry. Member States are allowed to levy charges for the issuance of such permits.

Council Directive 2003/86/EC on the right to family reunification determines the conditions under which family reunification is granted, as well as the rights of the family members concerned. In particular, article 13.2 of the Directive foresees that Member States issue a renewable residence permit

to family members of at least one year. Article 15.1 of the Directive foresees that that after five years of residence at the latest, and if no residence permit was granted for other reasons, Member States must issue, upon application, an autonomous residence permit, independent of the sponsor, to the spouse or unmarried partner and a child who has reached majority. Member States are allowed to levy charges for the issuance of such permits.

Council Directive 2009/50/EC on the conditions of entry and residence of third-country nationals for the purposes of highly qualified employment (so called 'Blue Card Directive') facilitates access to the labour market and entitles holders to socio-economic rights and favourable conditions for family reunification and movement around the EU. In particular, article 7 of the Directive foresees that a third-country national who has applied and fulfils the requirements set out in Article 5 and for whom the competent authorities have taken a positive decision in accordance with Article 8 shall be issued with an EU Blue Card. Member States are allowed to levy charges for the issuance of such an 'EU Blue Card' permit.

Council Directive 2004/114/EC determines the conditions of admission of third-country nationals for the purposes of studies, pupil exchange, unremunerated training or voluntary service. Only the rules for students are mandatory. The Directive foresees a set of general conditions (Art. 6) as well as specific conditions for students (Art. 7). Art. 11 determines that a residence permit for a student shall be issued for at least one year and be renewable if the general and specific conditions continue to be met. Art. 20 states that Member States may require applicants to pay fees for the processing of applications.

Council Directive 2005/71/EC creates a specific admission procedure for third-country nationals for the purposes of scientific research. The conditions for admission are laid down in Art. 7, while Art. 8 determines that the residence permit shall be issued for a period of at least one year if the conditions are met, and be renewable if the conditions continue to be met. Recital 21 states that Member States should have the right to charge applicants for the processing of applications.

Directive 2011/98/EU (so called "Single Permit Directive") became operational in the Member States at the latest on 25.12.2013. Article 10 (Fees) of that Directive states that "Member States may require applicants to pay fees, where appropriate, for handling applications in accordance with this Directive". The level of such fees shall be proportionate and may be based on the services actually provided for the processing of applications and the issuance of permits." This Directive applies to some residence cards issued under EU law (e. g. family reunification, students who have access to the labour market, Researchers) as well as national residence permits giving access to the labour market, and excludes a number of specific categories of workers (such as posted workers, seasonal workers, Intra corporate transferees, self-employed persons and EC long term residents).

Council Directive 2004/81/EC of 29 April 2004 defines the conditions for granting residence permits of limited duration to non-European Union (EU) nationals who are victims of human trafficking or (optionally) the subject of an action relating to the smuggling of people and who cooperate in the fight against these crimes. The permit may be granted to non-EU nationals even if they have irregularly entered the territory of an EU country. Art. 8 stipulates that the competent authorities are responsible for assessing whether the victim's presence is deemed necessary for the investigation or judicial proceedings, whether he/she has shown a clear intention to cooperate, and whether he/she has severed all relations with those suspected perpetrators. When these three conditions are fulfilled, and subject to public policy and national security, a residence permit of limited duration will be issued. The residence permit is valid for at least six months and may be renewed if the relevant conditions continue to be satisfied.

Austria	No	This EMN NCP has provided a response to the requesting EMN NCP. However, they have requested that it is not disseminated further.
Belgium		 I. Preliminary notes: The below-mentioned amounts represent fees to be borne by municipalities for the issuance of (inter alia) cards and residence permits for foreign nationals. They relate to manufacturing costs to produce the said documents. Beside manufacturing costs, municipalities, that issue residence permits, may apply local taxes. Municipal taxes are covered by municipal autonomy and therefore differ from one municipality to another. The below-mentioned amounts are applicable as from 1 January 2014. On 1 January of each year, amounts are automatically revised based on the variation of the health index. The below-mentioned amounts aren't distinguished by (i) first permit, renewal and replacement or (ii) the different types of permits (including cards A, B, C, D, E, E+, F, F+, H). Answer to question 1: Amounts borne by municipalities for issuing cards and residence permits to foreign nationals are as follows: Standard procedure: 15,20 Euros

2. Visa fees are indeed payable as follows:

- For transit or short stay, visa fees generally amount to **60 Euros**. This amount ("handling fee") covers administrative costs incurred by the processing of the visa application. Certain categories of applicants (namely children from 6 to 12 years old and nationals from countries with which the EU concluded an agreement facilitating the issuance of visas) pay a reduced fee amounting to **35 Euros**.
- For long stay, visa fees generally amount to **180 Euros**.

It is worth noting that certain categories are exempted from visa fees, including for example:

- Some students: recognized students grantees/fellows
- Some family reunification applicants: dependent spouse, child (below 21) and parent of Belgians, Union citizens or Swiss nationals
- Applicants for long stay visa from Morocco, Turkey, San Marino, Israel, Japan (bilateral agreements)
- Diplomatic and service passport holders in case of reciprocity.
- Applicants in justified situation of indigence.

3. Preliminary notes:

The EMN study "Attracting highly qualified and qualified third-country nationals to Belgium" notes on page 16 that "There is no special system that foresees a fast-track procedure for economic immigrants. The same general legislation on migration and residence as adopted in the Aliens Act is applicable on all foreigners. However, in 2008 a special economic migration service was founded within the Immigration Office. The aim is to facilitate and accelerate procedures for foreigners whose intentions are of economic interest and to prevent them from being hampered in their business due to slow administrative procedures".

The EMN study "Visa policy as migration channel in Belgium" further states on page 38 that: "By establishing the Smedem service, which

		provides for a fast-track procedure for economic migrants, Belgium has definitely done everything possible to let these applications run as smoothly as possible. In this regard, it is also worth mentioning the pragmatic delegation of authority by the IS to the consulates in cases where residence criteria of a more objective nature are concerned and where the intrinsic examination of the visa application therefore remains limited: this indeed applies pre-eminently to workers with a work permit. This possibility that the consulates have of personally issuing a D visa, combined with the quick issue of a residence permit without additional intrinsic examination in the territory is the simplest and quickest working method to attract employees within the current Belgian context ». Answer to question 3: The fast-track procedure offered by the Smedem service is not payable and applies to the following categories: Applicants for an EU blue card Highly qualified workers Researchers under hosting agreement Persons obtaining a professional card The Smedem approach, in cooperation with Belgian consulates, is centered on 4 lines of action: Quality of reception arrangements Swift handling of applications Lowering of burden of proof Types of visa issued Finally, it is noteworthy that Belgian consulates may cooperate with external service providers facilitating several actions (information, appointment making, receipt of requests, etc.). Additional fees are charged to applicants (/employers) making use of such services. Furthermore, fees and expenses will be charged for a number of further measures to be taken in accordance with the German Residence Act and issues concerning ID-cards and passports. Fees will also be charged for the processing of the applications, which may, as a matter of principle, only amount to fifty percent of the fee applied to official acts as applied for (e.g. the issuance of a residence permit) and which will be deducted thereof. There are regulations for exemptions from paying fees and reductions, especially in cases of need or when the official act is carried out for minors. Fees that are linked with the progress of the proceedings will not be charged.

Application for a residence permit based on strong humanitarian reasons and renewal of such permits cost NOK 1 100/133 Euro.

2. There is a fee for the application for a residence permit which covers the entire immigration process, including issuing a residence card as confirmation of the residence permit. When embassies and consulates outsource processing of applications and related services they can also make agreements about fees for the services.

Fees can vary. For Schengen-visas the fee can not exceed half of the Schengen fee. Examples of fees with an outsourced service are the following:
