AD HOC QUERY ON 2022.8 THE AUTOMATISM OF THE RENEWAL OF EU LONG-TERM RESIDENCE PERMIT (LRT)

Requested by EMN NCP Italy on 3 March 2022

1. Background information

The subject of the current AHQ regards the way EU Member States have interpreted article 8 of the Council Directive 2003/109/EC (concerning the status of third-country nationals who are long-term residents), under which: “Member States shall issue a long-term resident’s EC residence permit to long-term residents. The permit shall be valid at least for five years; it shall, upon application if required, be automatically renewable on expiry”.

This means that the expiry date of the EU long-term resident permit must be referred only to the material validity of the document and not to the long-term resident status, which is permanent.

So, according to the interpretation of the Directive, the automatism of the LTR permit’s renewal could be referred to:

- the ban of a new assessment of the initial conditions of stay or
- even to the prohibition to impose – after the first issue of the LTR permit – any other administrative fees.

In this sense, the Italian legislation explicitly states that: “EU residence permit for long-term residents certifies the permanent recognition of the LTR status (...). It is valid for 10 years and, upon expiration of the validity period (...), it shall be automatically renewed (prior submission of the renewal application accompanied with new photographs)”.

More specifically, the first issue of the LTR permit costs € 176,46, of which € 100 for an administrative fee and € 76,46 for the issuance costs. Instead, for the renewal of the LTR permit (so, 10 years after the first issue), Italian authorities shall not require a new evaluation of the residence requirements and the long-term resident should be required to pay only the issuance cost, without any further administrative fees.

2. Questions

- 1. How is interpreted the provision of Directive 2003/109/EC, art. 8, under which the renewal of LTR permit must take place "automatically"? Does your Member State provide a revaluation Is there a re-evaluation of requirements or an additional fee?**
- 2. What are the costs for the first issue of the LTR permit (administrative fee and issuance costs)?**
- 3. How long after does the LTR document expire and what obligations are required to the long-term resident who wants to renew his residence permit?**
- 4. What are the costs for renewal (if any) of LTR permit, divided between administrative fee and issuance costs?**

Given the permanent nature of the status granted by this card, the Code on Entry and Residence of Foreign Nationals and Right of Asylum (CESEDA) does not mention any time limit for applying for the renewal of the EU long-term residence permit. This is without prejudice to any provisions of the Directive 2003/109/EC relating to the loss or withdrawal of long-term resident status.</p> <p>2. According to section 44a of the Ordinance Governing Residence a fee of 109 EUR shall be charged for issuing a long-term residence permit. As per Article 91 of law nr. 4251/14 “The long-term resident residence permit is valid for five years and each time, it is renewed for five years, regardless of whether the conditions laid down in Article 89 [conditions for acquiring long-term residence status] are met or not. 2. Before the residence permit expires, the long-term resident must apply and submit the required supporting documents for its renewal to the service competent for receiving the application, pursuant to the provisions hereof”.</p> <p>As per article 92 the long-term resident must meet certain criteria pertaining to public order and security.</p> <p>Moreover, and as per ministerial decision nr 30825/14 published in the Government Gazette on 6th June 2014, an officially certified copy of the applicant’s passport is required or any other travel document recognised and accepted by the Hellenic authorities -in order to find out periods of absence from the country-, whilst as per joint ministerial decision nr 31399/18, a cost of 16 euros is required for the printing of the residence permit as a stand-alone document.</p> <p>2. As per ministerial decision nr 31398/18, an administrative fee of 150 euros is required plus an additional cost for the printing of the residence permit as a stand-alone document.</p> <p>3. As aforementioned, “the long-term resident residence permit is valid for five years and each time, it is renewed for five years, regardless of whether the conditions laid down in Article 89 [conditions for acquiring long-term residence status] are met or not.” As per par. 2 of Art.91 of Law nr 4251/14, “the long-term resident must apply and submit the required supporting documents for its renewal to the service competent for receiving the application, pursuant to the provisions hereof”, whilst meeting the necessary criteria pertaining to public order and security, the duration of his/her residence in the country and the existence of ties with the country.</p>

The long-term residence permit is issued for 5 years. The law does not specify the time when the foreigner must apply for the replacement of the LTR permit - i.e. the foreigner may apply during its validity or after its expiration. Once the online application for the replacement is submitted, the foreigner has 4 months to visit the Migration Department. If the foreigner fails to visit within 4 months, the application has to be resubmitted.
